Look to successful existing public-private partnerships as a model ie. Artscape's numerous developments in Toronto and Montreal's studio district. These should be concentrated near major public transit hubs like the go train stations and the TTC subway station
- 3 in consultation with local arts groups Vaughan needs to create a space for local artists to mount temporary exhibits. We have some historic buildings that are available for that but they are small and away from the foot traffic required for such a facility.
- 4 designate an "Arts District" and ensure that it includes all of the above items. The plans for Vaughan Metropolitan Centre should include something like this if it can't be done look to established areas like old Kleinburg ... could their library be expanded to include all of the above??? Is there any other city owned property there? The McMichael Art Gallery would be an ideal anchor around which the city could develop and Arts District.
